INTRODUCTION

The Register of Co-operative Research and Development Planning Documents is issued by the ICA Regional Office for East and Central Africa, as a medium for dissemination of recorded publications in the field of co-operative research and development planning, completed in the previous six years (from 1968) and produced by institutions operating in East Africa and Zambia, such as Co-operative Departments, Colleges, Co-operative Organisations, Research Institutes, etc.

Unfortunately, the ICA Office in Moshi cannot yet afford the maintenance of a library and annexed documentation. Centre, but we still thought that this should not hinder us from issuing a register of simple construction, which could be useful to researchers and planners in keeping themselves informed on what has been completed or is going on in their field.

To provide more perspective to the Research Register, we suggest that in future, after the first issue, new publications or documents to be included are accompanied by an abstract of 100 to a maximum of 300 words. Later on, this Register may also evolve into a more elaborate one, comprising subject classification at several entries for each publication listed.

It should be noted that only publications or documents listed under ICA Regional Office can be supplied by us. Requests for other material should be sent directly to the publishing institution, under which the document is mentioned.

To make the Register more complete, we have added under heading VI a selection of books and papers on co-operative. development in East Africa and Zambia, not yet mentioned under the publications lists of the related institutions, but brought out by other publishers in or outside the Region.

(Introduction cont'd)

To facilitate updating of the Register, it is issued in a loose leaf file system. Institutions will be asked once a year to complete the forms, and the ICA Regional Office will take care of multiplication and dissemination of the updated entrics.

All information sent out to the Regional Office will be copied to the ICA Research Department in London, for inclusion in the Directory of Institutions, engaged in Research on Co-operatives and the Research Register, set up in collaboration with the Polish and Hungarian Research Institutions. Regarding the Register for East Africa and Zambia, we thought that the exchange of information should not be limited to research studies alone, but should also contain other documents of practical interest to co-operative planners such as seminar reports, co-operative development plans, and also those manuals and textbooks, which could be useful to planners in any field of co-operative activity in finding solutions to their problems.

We thank you in advance for your collaboration in making this Register a useful instrument of mutual information in the Region and are looking forward to hear from you on any suggestions you may have for the improvement of its structure or contents.
