



F O R E W O R D

This is the second issue of a Calendar of Technical Assistance for Cooperatives. The first Calendar was issued in January, 1966 and stemmed from a Conference held in September, 1965 in Denmark. This Conference was called by the Danish Government and the Central Committee of the Danish Cooperative Movement and participants were invited from a number of countries involved in cooperative technical assistance to developing countries, on the basis of one Government representative and one representative of the national cooperative movement. In addition, international organisations were represented - the International Cooperative Alliance, the ILO, the FAO, and OECD.

The Conference agreed that the ICA could usefully compile a Calendar of seminars to be held in 1966, together with details of new or continuing projects. It was felt that this would provide a useful service and help to eliminate overlap in this field.

This Calendar does not pretend to be comprehensive, and recipients may well know of information which could usefully be included. The ICA would be grateful to receive details of seminars or projects for inclusion in any supplement which may be issued later in 1967.

- 1) The Calendar is in two parts. Part I gives details of seminars and conferences planned for 1967 in chronological order, as notified to the ICA. Part II gives details of new and continuing projects of a cooperative character which will be taking place in 1967. Details are given alphabetically by recipient countries. Details are given of regional projects, and publications.
- 2) Details of courses at a number of institutions are not included where these are continuing from previous years without further recruitment. e.g. the University of Marburg's two-year course in German for participants from African countries and the seminar for Latin American Housing Specialists organised by Gesamtverband Gemeinnütziger Wohnungsunternehmen, Köln; or, the courses are arranged from time to time. e.g. The Cooperative College at Sassel, Hamburg, Federal Republic of Germany; or, Institutions will receive students on request for appropriate courses. e.g. L'Ecole Supérieure Internationale de la Coopération, in Paris, for French-speaking students from developing countries.
- 3) It should be borne in mind that a number of countries accept students for courses in cooperative colleges and institutions where the courses are primarily designed for personnel of the national movement concerned. This is the case in Czechoslovakia, Federal Republic of Germany, France, Poland and the USSR. These courses are too numerous to list in such a Calendar and applications should be made to the national cooperative movement concerned, or the ICA, for further information.
- 4) Technical Assistance by some countries takes the form of training personnel for work in the developing countries. The USA and the Federal Republic of Germany are examples where cooperative organisations are responsible for planning a detailed course for persons wishing to work overseas in developing countries. In the USA, the Cooperative League of the USA conducts such courses, and, in the Federal Republic of Germany, the training is under the auspices of the "Freier Ausschuss der Deutschen Genossenschaftsverbände". On completion of the course, persons may then be employed by their Governments, International Agencies, or national cooperative organisations.
